Call to Order

Report of the Executive Officer Foresters Licensing

E.O. Stapleton has put forward renewal fee increases to the Board, which have been approved. He has put forth the Apprentice Professional Forester (APF) proposal which is in a 45-day public comment hold. Additionally, he has completed a budget change proposal and plans to put forth a proposal to increase application fees for the exams.

For Forest Service, E.O. Stapleton has discussed with staff chief the need to revive the MOU, which has not been updated since 1993. They have agreed that for forestry work they cannot do themselves, they will request or require the establishment of an RPF under contract.

E.O. Stapleton reported that 39 individuals took the October exam, and there are currently 26 applicants for the upcoming April exam, the majority of whom are returning applicants.

Discussion of Possible RPF Exam Fee Increases

E.O. Stapleton is proposing an exam application fee increase, as the projected per capita cost reaches \$468. He suggests raising the fee to \$410 to help cover the expenses associated with the examinations. He explained that the venues play a small part of the overall costs, but most of the cost stems from grading services.

No action taken.

Discussion of Qualifying Forestry Work Experience

E.O. Stapleton reviewed the proposed changes made to 1621.1 Qualifying Work Experience.

Member Eggleton moves to approve the changes, with the exception of the last portion of language C., "...provided, that the committee [PFEC] shall not make negative adjustments for time spent completing mandatory trainings required as a probationary condition of the forestry-related employment."

Member Snyder seconds the motion.
