Sonrisa is the first project to break ground and the first to be completed under Governor Newsom's Executive Order N-06-19 for Affordable Housing Development, which prioritizes affordable housing development on excess state-owned property and pursuit of sustainable, innovative, and cost-effective construction methods. The EO specifically prioritizes the use of renewable construction materials, such as cross-laminated timber (CLT). Sonrisa is the first ground-up CLT project in Sacramento. It is governed and made affordable by the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit Program and the HCD Transit-Oriented Development Program.

The Capitol Area Community Development Corporation (CACDC) partnered with CFY Development to develop this project. CACDC is the non-profit arm of the Capitol Area Development Authority (CADA), a unique public agency created in 1978 to foster and maintain housing that is accessible for a wide range of income levels and to maintain the vitality of the urban 24-hour community around the capitol. The site was made available through a development ground lease from the state.
